

# Natai Beach

A tranquil haven located in the province of Phang Nga, Natai Beach is a 10-kilometer stretch of beautiful sand and turquoise waters. This location gives travellers a feeling of exclusivity and a relaxing separation from bustling Phuket. In contrast to the other popular beach spots in the area with water sports activities and towering structures, Natai Beach simply offers lush greenery and an unobstructed view of the sparkling ocean, making it a perfect location for those who truly want to bask in the comforts of nature.

# Naithon Beach

Naithon Beach is a magnificent beach strip where visitors can enjoy a quiet swim away from the crowds. It is amazingly long and wide, well shaded by tall trees and divided in two by a small rock formation. Beyond these rocks, visitors can reach a more private area of Naithon. The sand is smooth, and swimming is excellent during the high season. Loungers, umbrellas and drinks are available as well as a small restaurant at the very south of Naithon.

# Naka Islands

The Naka Islands, also known as Koh Naka or Naga Islands, are two isles located on the northeast coast of Phuket. Naka Yai, the larger of these two islands, is rapidly gaining popularity among tourists with its wide, sandy beaches shaded by lush coconut trees. Naka Yai is an ideal place to visit for those looking for some time away from the bustling city but still want to enjoy exciting beach activities. Located south of Naka Yai is the other island, Naka Noi, also known as the "Pearl Island." A day trip in Naka Noi would usually include a demonstration of how pearls are farmed and extracted from the oyster. Visitors of Naka Noi can also buy pearls of all sizes from the island's pearl shop.

A great location for snorkeling, Koh Khai Nok is known for having different species of tropical fish that swim within the waters that surround the island. Used to the presence of humans, these charming aquatic creatures comfortably swim with the tourists paving way for guests to have that picture-perfect opportunity of swimming alongside colorful fish. The island itself offers a lot of scenic locations where visitors can take photos.
